- 7) The Claimant shall endeavour to agree a bundle of relevant documents with the Defendant, and shall in any event file and serve an indexed and paginated bundle at least three clear working days before the hearing.
- 8) The disposal hearing shall be listed on the first available date after Monday, 19th December 2005 with a time estimate of thirty minutes. If a notice giving details of the time and place of the hearing is not enclosed with this Order, one will be sent to you shortly.
